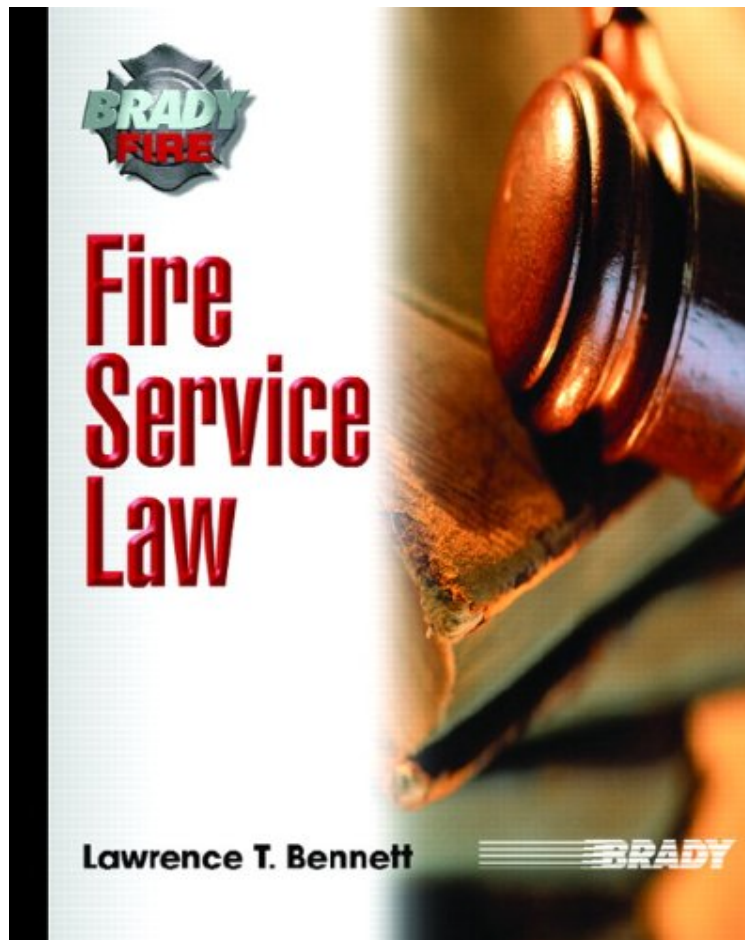

Lawrence is general counsel for the Warren County (OH) Fire Chiefs Association and has now become legal counsel for the Commission on Accreditation of Air Transport Systems, which certifies air care operations nationwide .
