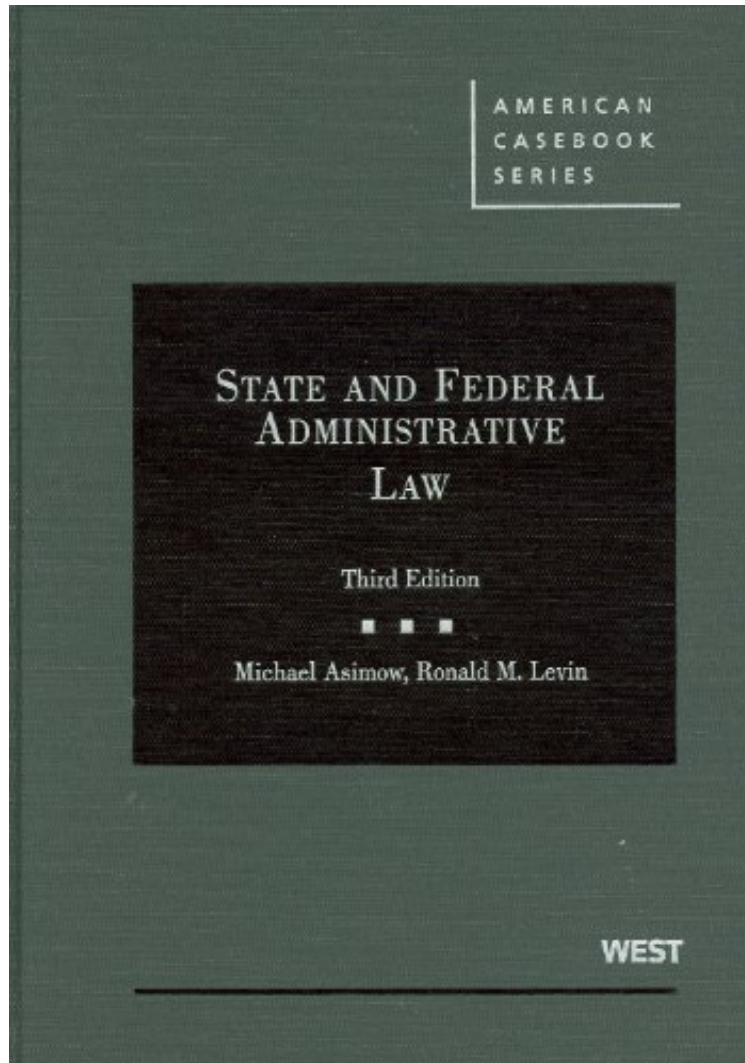

The only complaint I have is that certain sections seem a little over simplified. We spend a lot more time in the course on material that is provided very little in the text.
