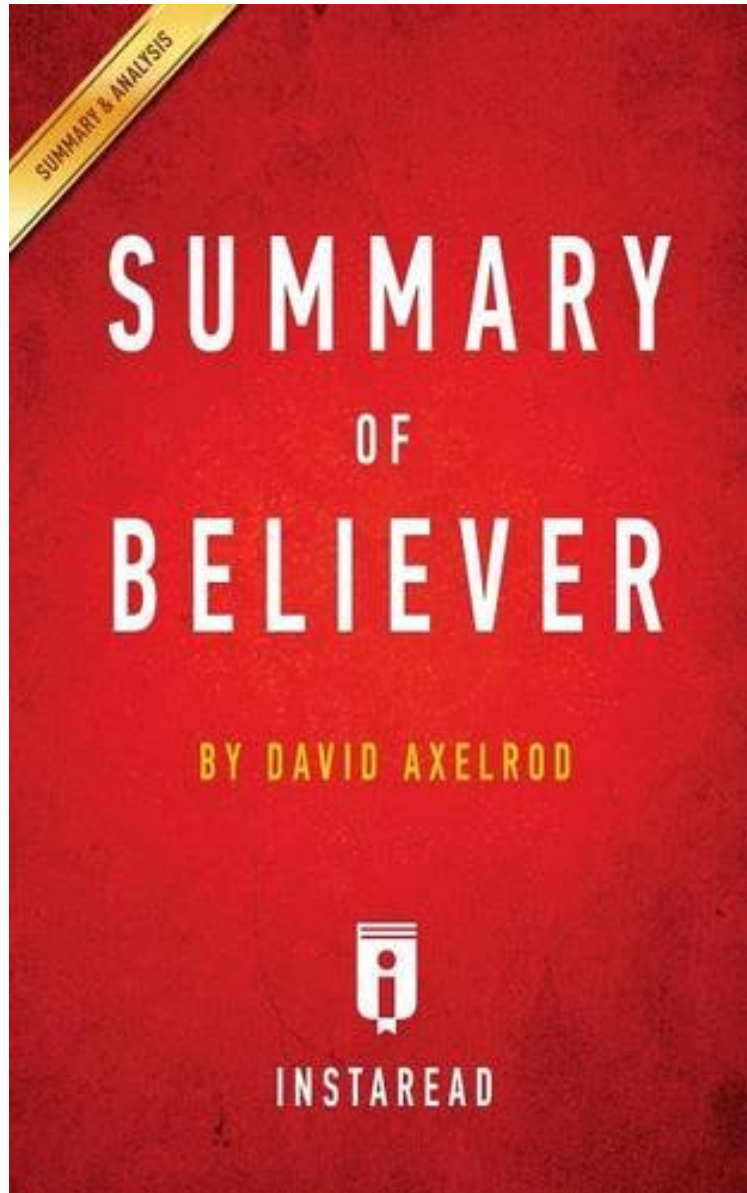

But I did start reading *Believer* and am glad I didn't let the dryness of the 15 minute version prevent me from doing so. The book is very readable and the stories are memorable. Myril, on the other hand, rose to the top on Madison Avenue as an advertising executive. Their marriage ended by the time Axelrod was eight.
