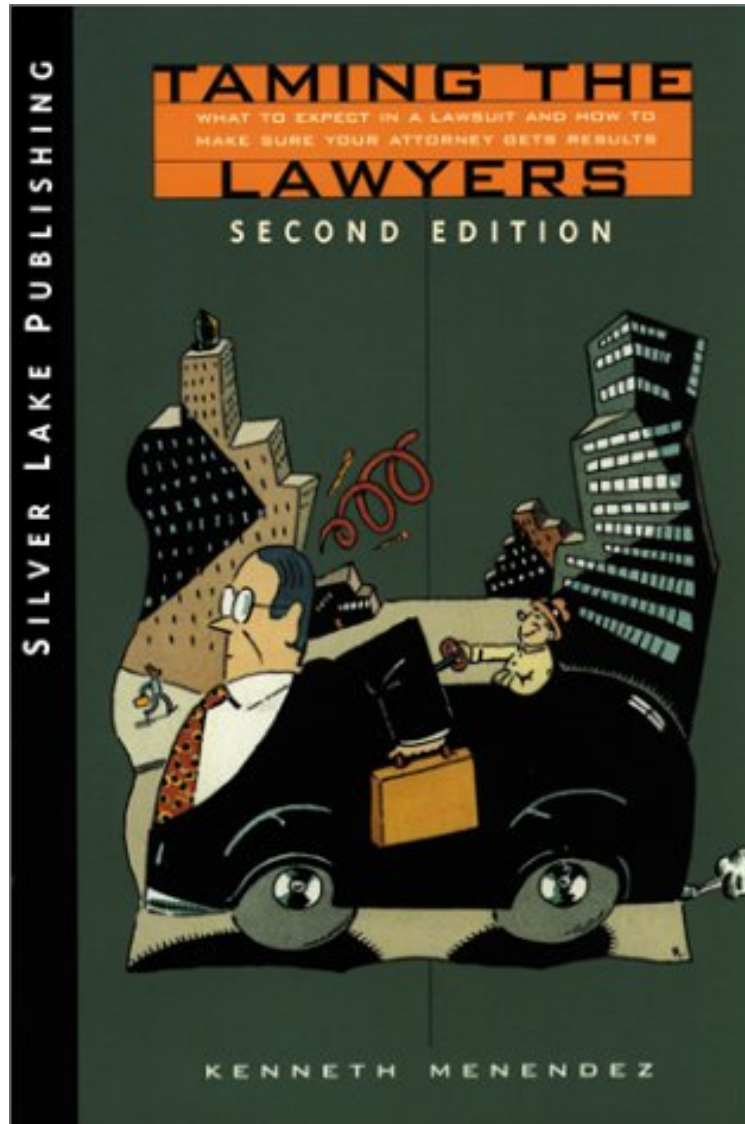

Don't expect the chatty style you sometimes find in "Dummies" books; there's a gray quality to it; the author doesn't try to hide fact that he himself is a practicing lawyer.He doesn't neglect those elements of the

legal that derive from the case itself, rather than just the lawyer's personality or modus operandi. In fact, it's quite a good introduction to what it means to "go to law", or be dragged to it. The author takes a holistic approach to law, like every good lawyer. His advice: "Don't hire lawyers, stay out of court, if you can". But of course, it isn't always possible, and there you are.
