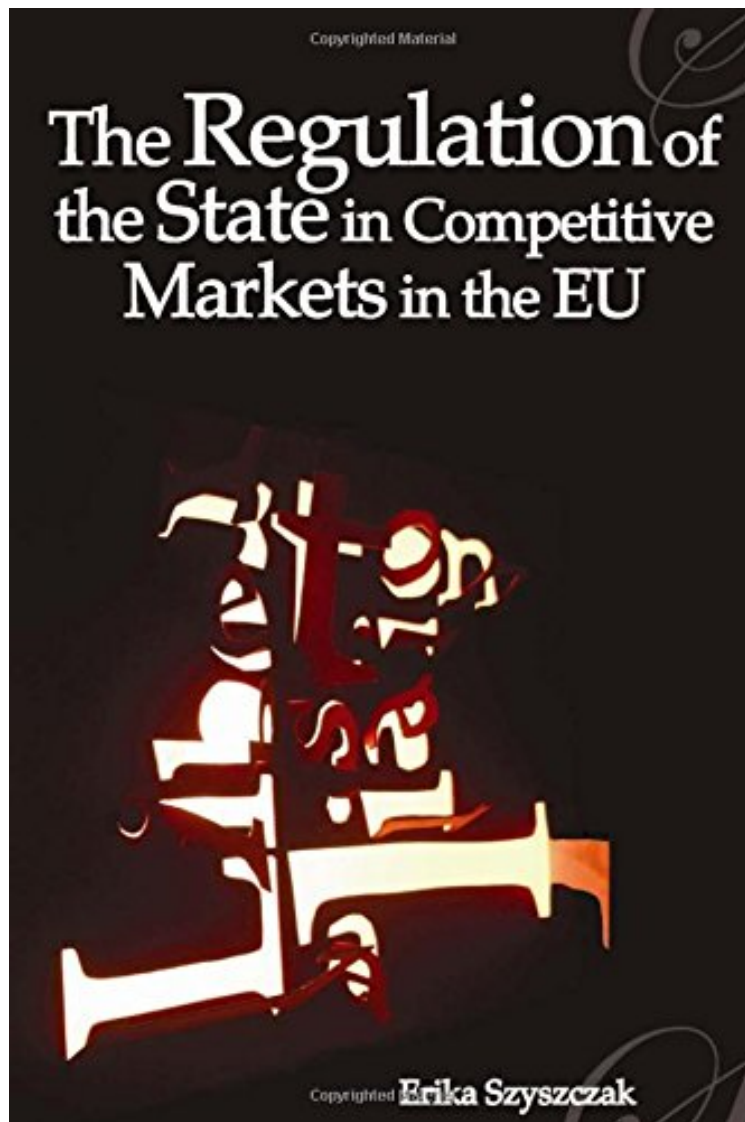

Other chapters examine the processes of privatization and liberalization with case studies on the postal sector, utilities, and telecommunications.
